


# Countertransference in forensic inpatients

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#### « Countertransference »

• Clinician's reactions to the patient (conscious/unconscious, emotional/cognitive, intrapsychic/behavioural)





#### Literature

Diagnostic and therapeutic value

- If unchecked,
  - Acting-out (punitive or coercive reactions)
  - − Drains staff → Burn-out
  - Staff reactions Splitting and disagreement
  - Impact risk assessment and decision making
  - + Blinded by positive/seductive CT





### CT in forensic settings

• Heinous/sadistic crimes, absence of remorse, incapable of emotional attachment, predation, ...

• Negative CT is predominant (anger, hostility, criticism, ...)


Personality > Symptoms predictor CT

Gender differences & clinical experience



### In this study...

- Therapist Response Questionnaire
  - 41. I tell him/her I'm angry at him/her.
  - 42. I feel like I want to protect him/her.
  - 43. I regret things I have said to him/her.
  - 44. I feel like I'm being mean or cruel to him/her.
- Male forensic patients with psychosis
- 45 personnel members, 139 protocols
  - Female vs. Male
  - Nurses vs Psychologists/Psychiatrists







## Results (1/4)

- Psychologists/Psychiatrists vs. Nurses
  - More Parental/Protective, Overwhelmed/Disorganized, Special/Overinvolved feelings [all effect sizes: often small, sometimes moderate]

- Women vs. Men
  - Less Special/Overinvolved feelings



 Women psychologists/psychiatrists reported higher Positive-Satisfying feelings than men.





# Results (2/4)

• Staff experience ~ Hostile/Mistreated feelings (r=.23, p<.01)

- Staff personality
  - Extraversion ~ less overwhelmed and overinvolved
  - Conscientiousness ~ less overwhelmed and overinvolved
- Diagnosis:
  - Personality Disorder ~ Hostile/Mistreated
  - Substance Abuse → no impact



## Results (3/4)

- Known offenses.
  - Offenses against a person
    - $\sim \sqrt{\text{Positive-Satisfying (F(1,127)=6.48, p=.01)}}$ .
    - For nursing personnel:  $\uparrow$  Hostile-Mistreated feelings (F(1,62)=7.7, p<.01)


- Age, Duration and Length of treatment.
  - Patient age → no impact
  - Duration of compulsive care/treatment
    - ~ Hostile/Mistreated (r=.20 and r=.32, p<.01).</li>
    - $\psi$  positive satisfying (r=-.21, p=.02).





## Results (4/4)

- Cooperativeness
  - ↓ hostile-mistreated (r=-.39\*\*)
  - ↓ helpless-inadequate feelings (r=-.34\*\*)
  - **↓** overwhelmed-disorganized (r=-.29\*\*)
  - $\psi$  disengagement (r=-.19\*)
  - ↑ positive-satisfying (r=.28\*\*)
  - Magnitude of correlations
    - nursing > psychologists/psychiatrists,
    - female>male





#### Conclusions

- Forensic variables do impact CT

  - ▶ Positive-Satisfying feelings

Many differences between nurses vs. psychologists/psychiatrists.
Less differences according to gender

• Further research is warranted (agression, antisocial traits, paranoid, ...)
